Job description for the Nurture Group Learning Support Assistant

<u>Salary - Surrey Pay</u>

<u>Hours:</u> 10 hours a week, term time only (Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday mornings)

Responsible to the teacher in charge of the Nurture Group/SENCO and ultimately the Headteacher.

Purpose: To liaise with the teacher in charge of the Nurture Group/SENCO in providing a caring and supportive environment for pupils with particular, often profound special needs who may exhibit serious behavioural problems, which would enable them to participate fully in all aspects of school life.

Core Purpose

To work in partnership with the teacher and provide high quality nurture room provision.

Knowledge and Understanding

Understand and be an advocate for Nurture Group principles.

	Responsibilities
1	Under the direction of the Teacher in charge/SENCO, ensure that support is provided to pupils through a carefully structured day which balances learning, affection and discipline in a caring and homelike atmosphere.
2	Attend regular meetings with the group teacher to ensure effective communication. Liaise with the Teacher in charge/SENCO about the planning and implementation and review of both group and individual programmes. Participate in appropriate INSET training.
3	Monitor the progress of individual children as requested, referring difficulties or concerns to the Teacher in charge/Senco or the Head teacher. This includes recording daily observations of children's behaviour.
4	Provide practical assistance as required.

	Duties	
1	Provide support in the classroom under the direction of the Teacher in charge/Senco. This may include: Encouraging language development. Supporting the development of skills. Supporting all aspects of learning. Supporting the emotional development of children. Undertaking practical activities e.g. baking, play, art. Supporting with reading, writing and other aspects of the learning process. Carrying out tasks planned, prepared and monitored by the Teacher

7	Make, devise and maintain equipment as required, ensuring that the classroom is kept in a clean and tidy condition.	
8	Act as a confidente to the children whilst being aware of current child protection guidelines.
